

**UCMUG MEETING — August 18 , 2009 — 6:30pm  
At Cumberland Cove, Welcome Center**

President Bob Weaver opened the meeting by requesting reports from Treasurer Bill Reichert and Secretary Rog Westlake. Bill reported a current balance of \$2,093.21. Woody Geisler moved for acceptance of both the Secretary's and Treasurer's reports. Motion seconded by Larry Meyers. Motion unanimously passed.

Bob Weaver started the meeting mentioning that the newest Apples have included with them five new maintenance programs to help keeping up the health of your computer. He mentioned how he had run into difficulties and had successfully used a recent version of Warrior vrs. A.4.1. Warrior seems to be more successful than Tech Pro.

Bob asked the question of our group on how many of us were using Apple Script. The replies were only "luke warm". He said the Apple ran a survey of Apple owners and found that the learning details and complexities discouraged real acceptance. This was a disappointment to Apple. Bob did run a simple script to record your reaction and then attach it to a file. Apple Script Editor was shown and explained.

Recently on the newer Apple systems is Automator. If you need to simplify a project that requires bringing up a number different files, programs, etc.— just drag them into the Automators workflow window and save. Each time you need to work on the project just open up the saved Automator.

Of course, there were a number a questions for clarification on the ways to short cut the procedures for doing repetitive actions.

Meeting adjourned shortly after eight pm.
